### How to do your 2021 tax return

Tax returns this year look a bit different. The old way of the paper-based group certificates has gone, and tax has gone digital. Income tax information has been uploaded to the Australia Tax Office (ATO) by your employer and can be easily accessed by tax agents (people who specialise in completing tax returns).

You simply have to contact an agent (a list can be provided from the IKC or Centerlink if required) and give them permission to access your tax information. They will complete and lodge your tax return and their service fee can be taken out of your tax return.

### Important COVID-19 Information

From 9 July 2021, use of Check in Qld by a range of new sectors is mandatory. These include venues that attract large crowds, such as stadiums, convention centres, theme parks, concert venues and cinemas; shopping centres and supermarkets and beauty and personal care service, such as hairdressing, beauty therapy and nail services.

As a customer, collecting your information electronically will mean faster and easier check-in at venues, and faster contact tracing in the event of an outbreak.

The changes that when visiting the Post Office, Library, Shop, Council Office, Art Centre you will be required to use the app or complete the form at the venue to allow for better contact tracing in the event of an outbreak.

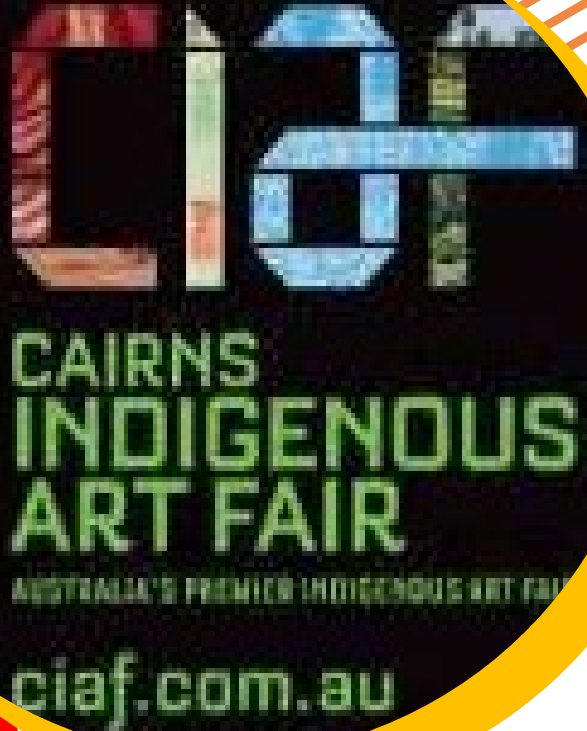

## Have you considered starting your own small business in community?

Ever thought of making some money by working for yourself? Becoming a sole trader could be the answer for you. If you're looking at starting your business as a sole trader, consider the following key elements. A sole trader business structure:

- is simple to set up and operate
- gives you full control of your assets and business decisions
- requires fewer reporting requirements and is generally a low-cost structure
- allows you to use your individual tax file number (TFN) to lodge tax returns
- doesn't require a separate business bank account, although this is recommended to make it easier to keep track of your business income and expenses
- requires you to keep financial records for at least 5 years
- has unlimited liability and all your personal assets are at risk if things go wrong
- doesn't allow you to split business profits or losses made with family members
- makes you personally liable to pay tax on all the income derived

A few ideas with relatively low start-up costs for the Wujal community are:

- Cleaning Services
- Lawn Mowing Services
- IT Services
- Second Hand Goods Sales
- Photography
- Car Wash and Detailing

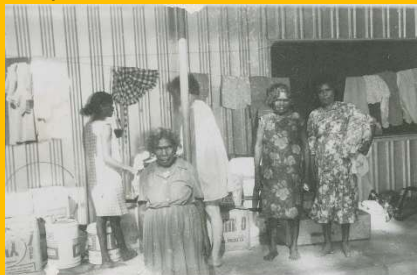
