



Community Meeting

A Community Meeting was held 26/05/21 under the mango tree to inform the community of the current financial position of Council. The CEO,

Steve Wilton, and Mayor, Bradley Creek, explained that State Government have appointed financial controllers as of January of this year to assist Council in fixing the current financial problems. The CEO explained that Council were struggling to pay bills and changes are needed in the way Council conducts its business. This may mean that when staff resign from Council they won't be replaced (depending on the position), service delivery may change e.g. reduced hours for the Post Office.

Other cost saving measures have included reducing the size of Council's fleet (cars/machinery etc.) and the possibility of reduced hours for staff.

Council will do their best to keep as many local people employed as possible and use local workers over contractors. If positions become available preference will be given to locals. If you have any questions or suggestions, please see Steve or Bradley.



