



Water Usage Notice

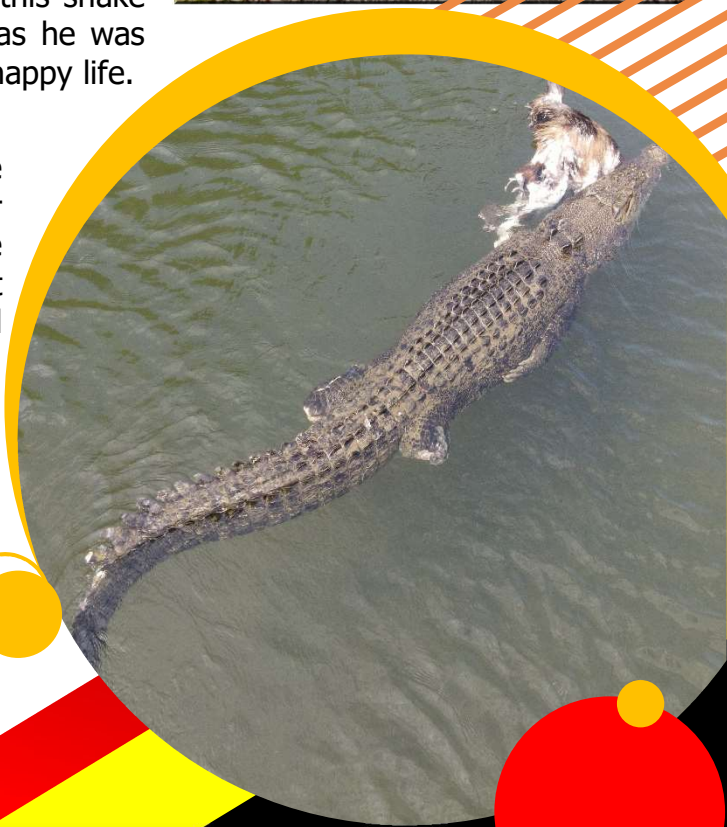

Tuesday's events were held at Bloomfield River State School with many activities including a massive inflatable slide and art competition. All the kids sang the Wujal rap and performed a Corroboree for their guests.

Wednesday was the elders lunch held in the hall with the boys from the depot and justice group staff providing fresh ngawiya cooked in the kurruma along with steak, roast pork, corned beef, salad and rice. Even though it was a little late it was delicious, and the year 5/6 class did a wonderful job of serving the food.

While the food was being prepared the elders and other community members did some weaving, spear making, clap sticks and tie dying activities.

Thursday was the main community celebration day when the whole community came together and marched from the clinic to the community hall where the main celebrations were held. Bloomfield River State School supplied a yummy lunch after which the "main event" was held. Mary Barlow from the Queensland Police Service organised a waybal dance battle.

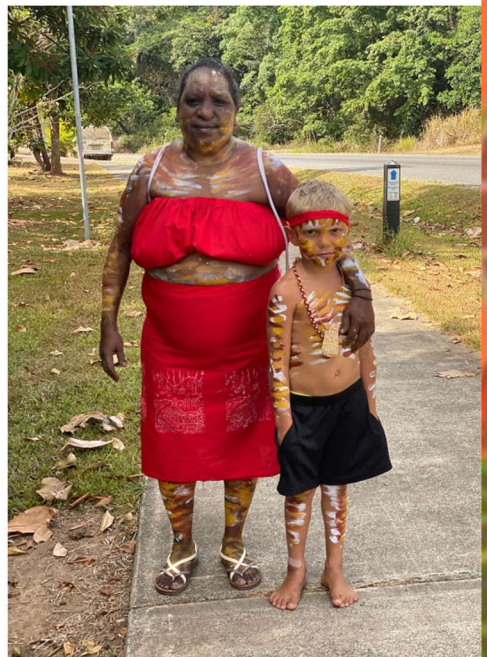
Principle Reece Toomey took out the inaugural trophy. Heaps of the community joined in to support the contestants and there was plenty of laughs along the way.

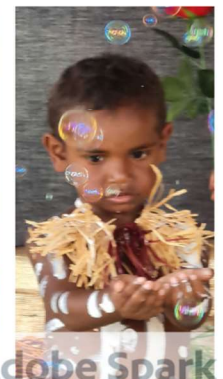
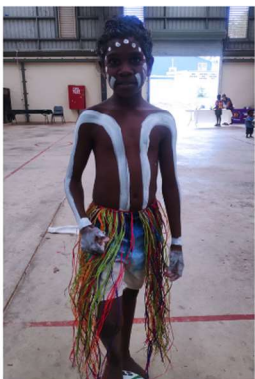

The purpose of the Family Wellbeing Service is to support:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families across a range of contexts, including early intervention, to keep children and young people safely at home with their families and in their communities.
- Families with children that are subject to ongoing intervention by child safety under Child Safety Orders.
- At-risk and vulnerable families with early intervention to keep children from entering the statutory child protection system.
- Families with children and young people under the age of 18 years old.

OUR FAMILY WELLBEING TEAM WILL SUPPORT YOU TO:

- Focus on the safety and protection of your children.
- Support families and family groups in a supportive cultural context that is holistic and empowering.
- Assist families to make changes in their lives and their children's lives, which will in turn strengthen our people and the communities in which they live.
- Support families to ensure that children remain with parents and caregivers to keep families together.
- Make a decision about the type and level of support that may be required for your family.
- Refer your family, if necessary, to partner organisations / services that will help you.



WHAT CAN WE DO FOR YOUR FAMILY?

If you feel that you are struggling with the job of raising your family, we can help support you in a number of ways:

- Valuing and supporting families as the primary place of nurturing for children.
- Developing positive practical parenting skills.

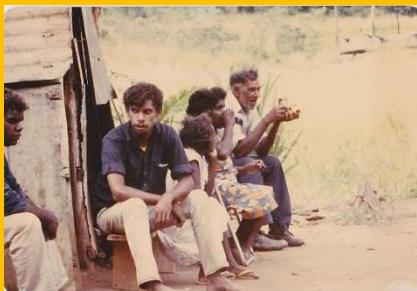

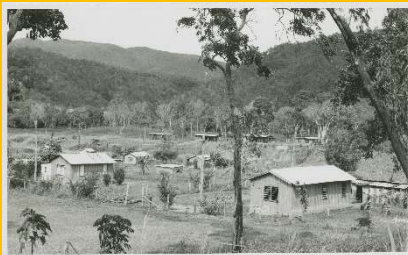
